Careers' Corner

We would like to extend a warm invitation to the parents/guardians of our **Sixth Year** students to attend an information evening taking place this Monday (24th September) regarding the C.A.O. system (including information on Universities, Institutes of Technology and access routes). The talks are due to take place at 7.15 p.m. sharp and are for parents/guardians only. Students **are not expected** to attend.

Sixth Year students are currently receiving information on these topics in school from the Guidance Counsellor. C.A.O. booklets are currently being distributed during information-classes. The C.A.O. are due to send additional books to the school as soon as possible, so any student who does not receive a book this week, will be notified once they arrive in.

It is advised that when students receive their C.A.O. booklets they should bring them home. The booklets contain large amounts of information in the front sections that will help students. The website - <u>www.cao.ie</u> - contains very clear videos and information sections. The website will be updated in November to allow students view a demonstration version of the online application form for the 2019 applications that will include looking at the Supplementary Information Form for DARE.

In November, the C.A.O. will host information events for Guidance Counsellors. Any relevant information provided will be passed onto students regarding changes etc.

Students who wish to apply for the **D.A.R.E. scheme** are requested to make themselves known to the Guidance Counsellor as soon as possible.

Students wishing to apply for the **U.C.A.S. scheme** have been reminded that they should have now registered and started their applications.

Students who are interested in **apprenticeships** are asked to ensure that they have references which they can include with their C.V. or Application Forms when applying for positions later in the year.

We are looking forward to hosting a Careers' Fair in October when representatives from a number of Third-Level Institutions, Apprenticeship Boards, the Army, Garda Síochána and other career-groups will come into the school during a school-morning to meet students. Further details about this will be given nearer the event.

Transition Year visit to Courts

All transition year students will visit the Criminal Courts of Justice this year as part of the redesigned Politics & Law module.

The first group to go to the courts in October will be TY Beckett who are currently taking this module on Thursday mornings. The Law element has been designed in conjunction with two past-pupils, Seán Masterson and Mathew Somers, who are currently studying Law and is based around a mock trial scenario which is frequently used in legal education.

On Thursday 20th September, TYB students met with Mathew Somers to hear a presentation on the conduct of a criminal trial and to get advice on preparing the roles they have been assigned for their mock trial. When they go to the criminal courts, they will have the opportunity to role play their mock trial in a courtroom with the guidance of a barrister as well as sitting in on a criminal trial in progress.

We are most grateful to Seán and Mathew for giving of their time and hope that this experience will encourage more Coláiste Éanna students to consider careers in Law.
